

WEEE and ROHS Regulations

The Restriction of the Use of Certain Hazardous Substances in Electrical Equipment Regulations RoHS II 2011/65/EU covers the same scope as The Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment Directive 2007 (WEEE). Batteries and accumulators do not fall into any of the ten categories listed within the Regulations.

The European Directive that is directly relevant to batteries and accumulators is Directive 2006/66/EC. There are two pieces of legislation that translate this Directive into UK Law:

The Batteries and Accumulators (Placing on the Market) Regulations 2008

The Waste Batteries and Accumulators Regulations 2009
